UNMISS “PROTECTION OF CIVILIANS” (PoC) SITES ¹

- As of 19 March, the estimated number of civilians seeking safety in six Protection of Civilians (PoC) sites located on UNMISS bases is 112,590 including 34,674 in Juba UN House, 21,368 in Malakal, 2,374 in Bor, 52,908 in Bentiu, 362 in Wau and 904 in Melut.
